LA FESTA DEI SETTE PESCI THE FEAST OF SEVEN FISHES

The four weeks before Christmas are of part of the Advent season and it was a time of reflection and fasting. Christmas Eve was a time of abstaining from meat and thus fish was served. Especially in Southern Italy, the meal evolved into a grand dinner with a tradition of serving seven different types of fish dishes. Many homes got around this by making variation of a fish soup called *cioppino* or *brodetto*, in which seven, or less, types of fish or crustaceans were served in one pot.

For our *Pranzo di Natale*, Christmas Dinner, we encourage our members to bring as a side dish, a fish entry that may be traditional to your region or one of your choosing. Check on the internet for information about *la Festa dei Sette Pesci*, and try one of the recipes....it will be fun to try some of these traditional dishes.

CHRISTIMAS IN ITALY NATALE IN ITALIA



Christmas in Italy is rich in traditions that have, for most part a religious history, with the celebration centered on the nativity scenes in churches and home. Italian customs and traditions add so much to the beautiful celebration of Christmas in America for families of Italian heritage had help teach the younger family members about the value of their Italian heritage.

The Christmas season in Italy includes is **Festa di San Nicolo'** which is celebrated on December 6th and la **Festa di Santa Lucia**, also known as "the Festival of Lights" which is celebrated on December 13th.



Il presepio is the nativity scene featuring the *Holy Family*, *I pastori* (shepherds), *I Re Magi* (the Three Kings), and angels that is seen in the homes and churches in Italy on Christmas time. *St. Francis of Assisi* created the first *Presepio*.

Presepio vivente: On Christmas Eve many small towns of Italy celebrate with tradition of a live nativity scene to act out the birth of Jesus just as St. Francis of Assisi did in 123 A.D. Complete with live animals, children play the roles of the Holy Family with a newborn baby Jesus. Christmas carols originate in

Italy with St. Francis of Assisi. The classic Christmas carol of Italy include **Tu scendi dalle stelle**, and **Caro Gesu' Bambino**.



I zampognari and the shepherds who live in the mountains and come to town at Christmas time to play their traditional bagpipes and sing characteristic shepherd song. They dress in traditional vests, leggings and leather trousers.



Ceppo is an old Italian tradition known as the "Tree of lights" also known as the Italian Christmas pyramid, the *ceppo* is decorated with candles and holds a small manger, decorations, candy, fruit and greenery.

The meal of **la Vigilia di Natale** (Christmas Eve) is customarily meatless, popular known as the meal of **seven fishes** (for the seven sacraments), it typically consists of fish and seafood, and may include *eel*, *scungilli*, *calamari* (squid), *vongole* (clams) and *baccala'* (salt cod).

The Urn of Fate is an old tradition where people in Italy pick out gifts to family members from large ornamental clay jar.

Christmas Day, is an important religious holiday and an important family celebration in Italy and America. A tradition in some families has the youngest place *the figurina of Baby Jesus* in the presepio to recognize the birth of **Gesu' Bambino**. The family celebration of Christmas includes Mass and traditional banquet. Traditional **dolci** (sweet) include *panettone, pandoro, pizzelle, struffoli and torrone*.

Capo d'Anno (New Year's Eve) is welcomed with optimism for the future and aspiration of prosperity and good health. *Lentils* are traditionally eaten on New Year's day in Italy as a symbol of good luck and prosperity. *Zampone or cotechino* is a symbol for abundance because is the foot of the pig, rich in fat! The celebration of New Year presents the opportunity to give the "old" by throwing old objects such as broken plate and pots out of the window on New Year's Eve.

La befana is the benevolent old woman with magical powers who brings gifts to the children of Italy on the eve of Epiphany on January 6th, to commemorate the visit of the Three Kings. *La befana* has been known to visit children of Italian heritage in America and around the world.

These are a few customs of **Christmas in Italy**. We hope you enjoyed reading about them and perhaps will celebrate this special event in your family with Italian style.

ITALIAN CHRISTMAS SONG

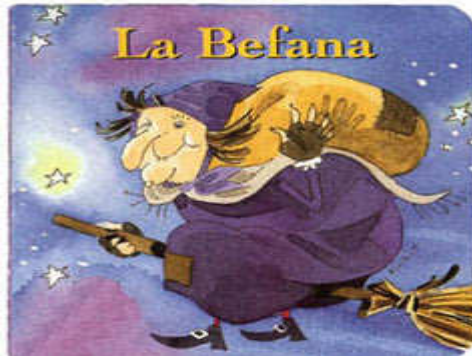

La Befana is an old lady who brings toys to children in part of Italy on Epiphany night. The Epiphany is when the Three Kings brought a gift to baby Jesus.

The legend is that on their way to deliver presents to Jesus, the Three Kings came across La Befana. They asked her to come with them, but she refused, saying she had too much housework to do. She later realized it had been wrong not to go with them. So she ran off with her broom in search of the Kings, bearing her own presents for the baby Jesus. But she never caught up with them. It's said that La Befana is still searching for the baby Jesus.

In the weeks preceding the Epiphany, the children of Italy are busy writing to La Befana, telling her the presents they would most like to receive; they are on their best behavior because they know that La Befana will leave a lump of coal instead of sweets and toys for ill-behaved children.

On Epiphany night, January 6, Befana goes around leaving presents for children, in imitation of the Three Wise men who brought gifts to Jesus. Befana looks like a friendly witch, with a mole on her face and tattered clothes. She flies on a broom and goes down chimneys to deliver toys for girls and boys.

There is a little poem:

**La Befana vien di notte
Con le scarpe tutte rotte
Col vestito alla romana
Viva viva La Befana!!**

**Porta cenere e carbone
Ai bambini cattivoni
Ai bambini belli e buoni
Porta chicchi e tanti doni!**

*The Befana comes by night
With her shoes all broken
With a dress in Roman style
Up, up with the Befana!!*

*She brings ashes and coal
To bad nasty children
To the nice Good children
She brings candies and many gifts!*

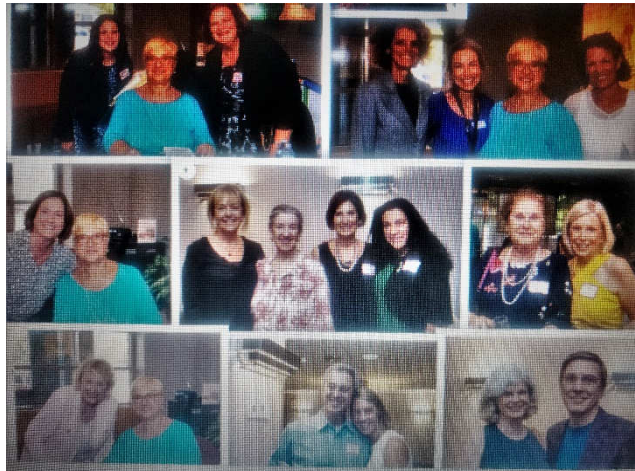

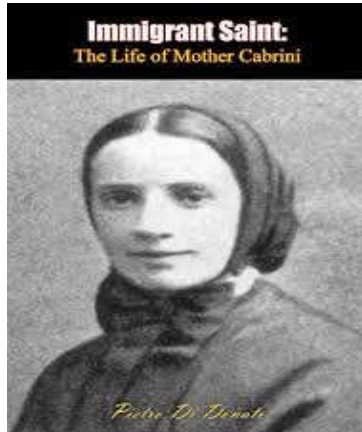

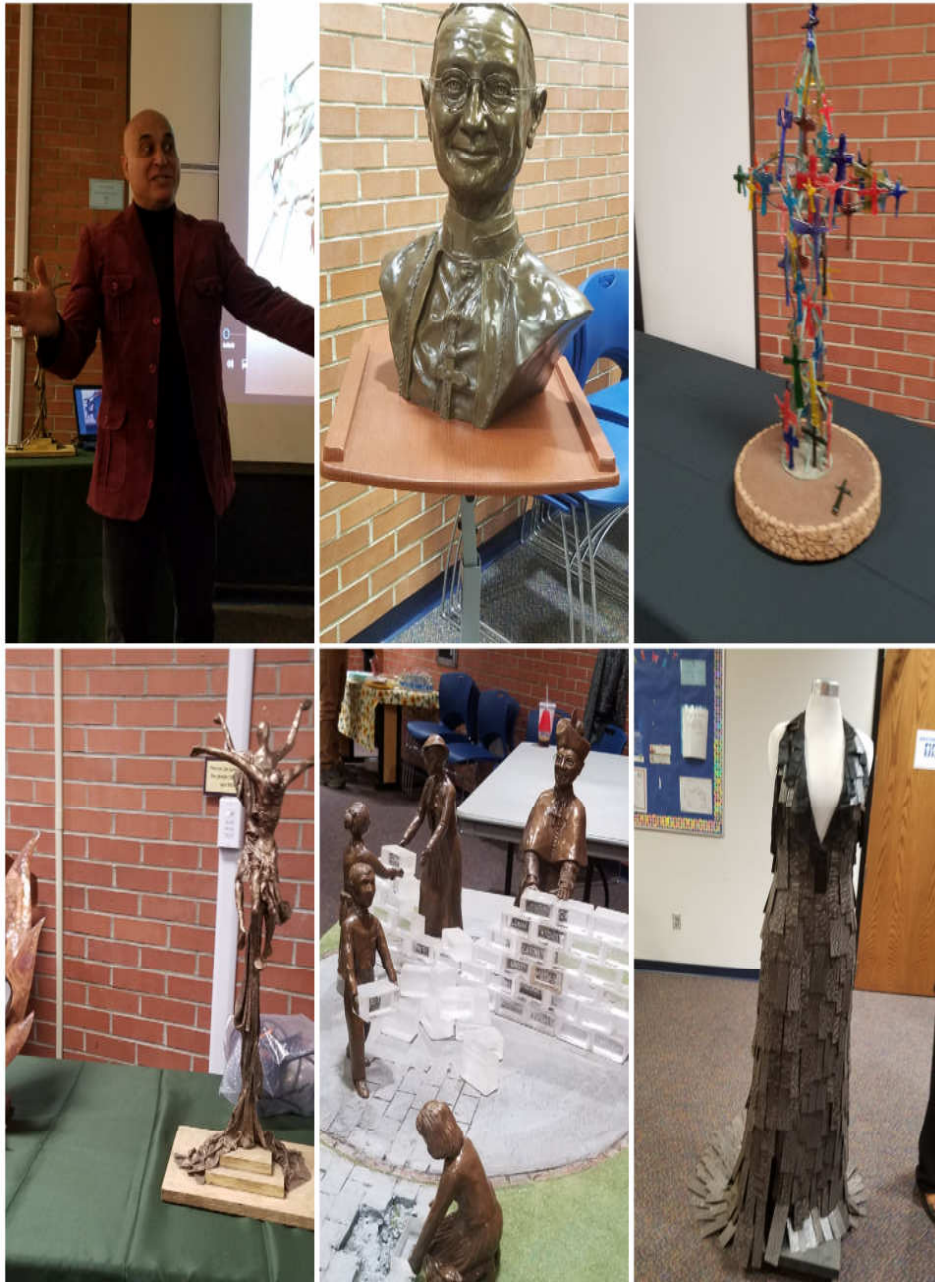
GUY TEDESCO, VISION AND BRIEF BIOGRAPHY

Guy Tedesco has an unusually varied wealth of experiences and works in a broad range of artistic fields, disciplines, and media in equally as many styles of interpretation . For the past 30 years the focus of Guy's work is in the form of monumental sculpture with a primary focus on cast sculpture in materials from bronze to glass and resin. Primarily specializing in realistic representations of historic or religious figures, Guy also creates works of contemporary form and function. The style and presentation are always dictated by the project, Guy doesn't like to limit himself in expression what is best for the client or the subject. Very often Guy mixes media, materials and style of presentation in monumental design to fully engage the audience and represent the true personalities and goals of the subject and the commissioning body. Art, representational and *realistic* to conceptual and fully abstracted is first and foremost a means of communication. From simple ideas to deeply philosophical and spiritual concepts, successful works of art should not only portray and represent thoughts, they should inspire thought and action in their viewers.

From early years in New York's fashion industry working for private clients and many of New York's top apparel designers, helping design and establish the first Planet Hollywood restaurant in New York City, unique custom furniture and interior design and fabrication, creating works of wearable art, theatrical costume and set design for stage and screen to deeply philosophical, theological works of spiritual art and worship space design, his works both here In the USA and abroad have served to entertain and inspire everyone who encounters them. He has painted murals for the New York Children's museum, was the chief sculptor for the Saudi Arabian Government, Prince Bandar, on a \$30 million project traveling the North American continent, has worked as far away as Japan, and has art pieces in the Phillipine Islands, France, Italy, China, and the Vatican. He has works in New York City, Washington DC, Las Vegas, Atlanta, Los Angeles, San Diego, Montana, Florida and Washington State not to mention his many project in Kentucky and Indiana.
